Adult Gardening Program Scheduled for May 13

On Tuesday, May 13 at 7:00 p.m. Munnell Run Farm will offer its third annual adult gardening program. Certified arborist Tom Kavanagh, of Cottage Gardens, will present "Pruning 101: How & When Do I Prune That?" He will discuss the basics of pruning and how different techniques apply to the variety of plants found in your landscape. In addition, landscape designer Shannon McConnell, also of Cottage Gardens, will present "Design Inspirations for the Homeowner," which will give examples of how to create the feeling of various outdoor spaces in a residential setting. A \$5 donation is requested to help support the programs at the Farm.

Paper or Plastic? Neither!!!

Think of all the paper and plastic bags you have used while grocery shopping over the past year. A lot, right? Americans use 100 billion plastic shopping bags each year. Plastic bags start as crude oil, natural gas, or other petrochemical derivatives. They don't biodegrade, they photodegrade over hundreds of years, eventually breaking down into smaller, toxic components that contaminate soils, waterways, and enter the food web.

What about paper bags? Though paper bags are easier to recycle and more likely to be recycled, making plastic bags uses less energy and water and creates less air pollution and solid waste. They also take up less landfill space. However, many plastic bags never make it to the landfill, becoming airborne and getting caught in fences, vegetation, trees, getting eaten by animals, clogging gutters, sewers, and waterways. And only a very small percentage (0.6%) of the billions that are produced actually get recycled each year.

So, which is better? Neither! The best alternative is to pack your groceries in reusable cloth bags. They are strong, reliable, hold more than plastic bags, and are good for the environment. Challenge yourself and your friends to reduce and then eliminate the use of paper and plastic bags at the grocery store and all stores at which you shop.

Munnell Run Farm now has heavyweight 100% cotton canvas tote bags for you to purchase! They are 17 inches wide by 18 inches deep and are \$10.00 each. Friends of MRF get 10% off! Your Memberships Will “Build the Bathroom”

If you've ever visited Munnell Run Farm and needed to use the “facilities,” you know they are primitive, at best. After more than ten years of public programming, often with hundreds of visitors on site at the same time, we finally have plans to build adequate restroom facilities. The grant we recently received from the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources has some funding attached to help make this much-needed building a reality. We've also been “sitting on” \$5000 donated for a restroom by the Shenango Valley Foundation —please pardon the pun! However, the cost of the restroom is estimated at \$43,000 and may increase once construction actually begins.

The plans include hot and cold running water, and we are excited to be utilizing the latest “no flush” technology to demonstrate our commitment to conservation. Part of that decision, too, was based on avoiding an *additional* \$23,000 in sewer tap-in fees.

Why are we telling you all of this? Because we still need to offset approximately \$15,000 of the expected construction cost. For every membership we receive from now until the end of the year, the full amount will be applied to the “restroom fund”—unless you specify otherwise.
